Return of Service (ROS)



- BC funds IMGs with 2 years of residency training in exchange for a 2-year ROS on a full-time basis.
- On completion of residency, the physician is eligible for licensure and independent practice.
- ROS locations are the areas determined to be in greatest need by the Health Authority in which your Distributed Site is located.
- ROS communities can change each year.



ROS Commitment




- Government-funded services
- Build or assume a patient panel
- Devote a minimum of 1680 hours of patient care annually distributed over each month of the year
- ☐ Two-year period from the date the ROS commences
- □ ROS begins within 3 months of residency completion
- ☐ The Addendum outlines the service agreement for the ROS period

New-to-Practice (NTP) Incentives



One-Time Signing Bonus:

- \$25,000 (1.0 FTE)
- Eligibility based on residency completion year

Clinic Overhead Contribution:

• \$75,000 per year (1.0 FTE)

Medical Education Debt Relief Grant(s):

- Eligibility based on residency completion year
- Rates are up to \$50,000 in the first year of practice and potential of \$20,000 in years two through five
